Attaining the rank of Eagle Scout is a newsworthy event. Nationwide, only 2% of boys who start out in Scouting ever achieve this rank, a rare accomplishment.

Facebook: Send pictures of your Eagle Scout project to the council Facebook page (www.fb.com/shac.bsa). Also share pictures from your Eagle Scout Court of Honor.

Media: Eagle Scout information can be provided to the local news media. The troop committee or Eagle Scout's family can submit a photo and a press release.

Send a one page double-spaced news release and a suitable photo to your local newspaper, religious newsletter, church newsletter, or chartering organization newsletter.

The photos could either be a portrait or a picture of the Eagle Scout in action working on his service project. In some cases, the uniqueness of the ceremony, participants, or presenters involved will make the ceremony of interest to the daily newspapers or even television.
